Rollover Protection System (ROPS) for a Cab

- The cab is an integral part of the ROPS, which is an effective safety device.
- The ROPS consists of the cab, the seat, the seat belt, and the seat latch.
- Use the seat belt when operating the machine with a cab.

Cab Kit

- Ensure that the seat belt can be released quickly in the event of an emergency.
- Drive slowly and carefully.
- Check carefully for overhead clearances (i.e., branches, doorways, electrical wires) before driving under any objects and do not contact them.
- Keep the cab in safe operating condition by periodically thoroughly inspecting for damage and keeping all mounting fasteners tight.
- Replace a damaged cab. Do not repair or revise.
- **Do not** remove the ROPS.

1 Preparing the Machine

No Parts Required


Procedure

- 1. Park the machine on a level surface, shut off the engine, engage the parking brake, and remove the key from the ignition.
- 2. Allow the engine coolant to cool and then drain the coolant from the machine; refer to the *Service Manual*.
- 3. Disconnect the negative (-) battery cable from the battery.
- 4. Remove the bolt securing the brake pin that holds the brake pedals (Figure 1).



- 1. Bolt (1/4 x 3/4 inch) 3. Locknut (1/4 inch)
- 2. Brake pin
- 5. Ensure that the machine is secure from movement before you begin to work on it.
- 6. Remove the brake pin to allow the pedals to rest loosely on the footrest.
- 7. Tilt the steering column to its lowest position; refer to the *Operators Manual*.
- 8. Remove the roll bar from the machine (Figure 2).

Note: Use an assistant to help you remove the roll bar from the machine.



9. Carefully remove the roll bar from the machine.



Assembling the Front Mount

Press a rubber isolator into each hole in the front mount (Figure 3).


Note: Use soapy water and a mallet to insert the rubber isolator into the hole.

Press a rubber isolator into the hole in each of the rear mounts (Figure 4).

Note: Use soapy water and a mallet to insert the rubber isolator into the hole.









Applying the Seal to the Front Mount

1. Apply the seal to the mount flush with the front and side edges of the front mount (Figure 5).



Applying the Foam Seals to the Cab

Apply the seals to the cab while it is on the shipping pallet.


1. Secure the front mount to the machine 8 bolts $(1/2 \times 1-1/4 \text{ inches})$ and 8 locknuts (Figure 14).

Installing the Rear Mounts to the Machine

 Secure the left mount to the machine using 2 bolts (1/2 x 4-1/2 inches), 2 small washers, and 2 locknuts (Figure 15).



- Torque the bolt and nut to 127 to 157 N·m (94 to 116 ft-lb).
- 3. Repeat the previous steps to the mount on the other side of the machine.




Installing the Cab to the Machine

1. Use the Toro cab hoist, or similar, to support the cab (Figure 16).



Note: A Toro cab hoist is available through your Toro distributor.

2. Connect the cab hoist to the 4 lift points on the cab (Figure 17).

Important: Ensure that the lift system does not contact the headliner (Figure 18).





Installing the Floor Tread

1. Install the brake pin through the brake pedals.



Installing the Back Panel Components



Preparing the Short Hose Assembly

1. Apply sealant to the straight fitting (3/8 NPT x 5/8 barb), skipping the first thread.




- 2. Thread the straight fitting (3/8 NPT x 5/8 barb) to the female coupler (Figure 27).
- 3. Tighten the straight fitting (3/8 NPT x 5/8 barb) into the female coupler 2 to 3 turns from finger-tight.
- 4. Slip the dust plug over the barbed end of the assembly (Figure 27).
- 5. Slip both hose clamps over the hose.
- 6. Insert the barbed end of the assembly into the hose and secure it with the hose clamp (Figure 27).
- 7. Insert the barbed end of the tee fitting into the hose and secure it with the hose clamp (Figure 27).

Note: Remove any tag that may be present on the tee fitting.

1. Apply sealant to the straight fitting (3/8 NPT x 5/8 barb), skipping the first thread.







Installing the Temperature Sensor

Important: Whenever working with the electrical system, always disconnect the battery cables, black (-) cable first, to prevent possible wiring damage from short-outs.



Connecting the Power Wire

- 1. Locate and access the fuse block on the right side of the operator's seat.
- 2. Connect the wire for the cab power to an empty space in the fuse block (Figure 46)




Securing the Wiring Harness

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3. Route the wire harness from the machine toward the cab.



- 4. Position the magnetic mount onto the underside of the frame (Figure 53).
- 5. Connect the wire harness from the machine to the wire harness from the cab (Figure 53).
- 6. Ensure that the hood closes without interfering with the wire harness and correct if necessary.





- 4. Check for parts that interfere with moving parts and make corrections before operating the machine.
- 5. Connect the negative (-) battery cable to the battery.
- 6. Check the operation of all controls before operating the machine.
- 7. Have an assistant to adjust the rearview and side mirrors before operating the machine.

Windshield-Wiper Switch

Use this switch to turn the windshield wipers on or off (Figure 55).

Temperature Control

Rotate the temperature control knob to regulate the air temperature in the cab (Figure 55).

Fan Control


Rotate the fan control knob to regulate the speed of the fan (Figure 55).

Air-Recirculation Control

Sets the cab to either recirculate the air in the cabin or to draw air into the cabin from outside (Figure 55). Set the control to draw air in when using the fan or heater.


Power Outlet

Use this 12 V DC, 15 A power outlet to power compatible devices (Figure 56).



Windshield Latch

Lift the latches to open the windshield (Figure 57). Press in the latch to lock the windshield open. Pull out and down on the latch to close and secure the windshield.



Rear Window Latch

Lift the latches to open the rear window. Press in the latch to lock the windshield open. Pull out and down on the latch to close and secure the windshield. (Figure 57).

Important: You must close the rear window before you open the hood.

Cleaning


A CAUTION

If you leave the key in the switch, someone could accidently start the engine and seriously injure you or other bystanders.

Remove the key from the switch before you do any maintenance.

Cleaning the Cab

Important: Use care around the cab seals and lights (Figure 58). If you are using a pressure washer, keep the washer wand at least 0.6 m (2 ft) away from the machine. Do not use the pressure washer directly on the cab seals and lights or under the rear overhang.



Cleaning the Air Filters

Service Interval: After the first 250 hours (replace them if they are torn or excessively dirty).

1. Remove the thumb screws and the grates from both the in-cab and rear cab air filters (Figure 59).






- 4. Remove the bolt and nut securing the brake pin that holds the brake pedals (Figure 1).
- 5. Tilt the steering column to its lowest position; refer to the machine *Operators' Manual*.
- 6. Disconnect the black (-) cable from the battery.





1. Disconnect the washer hose (Figure 62).




2. Disconnect the heater hoses (Figure 63).

Removing the Cab

- 1. Connect the cab hoist to the 4 lift points on the cab (Figure 17).
- 2. Remove the bolts, the washers, and the locknuts securing the cab to the machine; refer to step 5 and step 7 in Installing the Cab to the Machine (page 11).

Note: Return all the hardware that you removed to the original mounting location in the order it is used to secure the cab to the machine. This can prevent losing the mounting hardware and simplify installation.

- 3. Raise the cab to a height that will allow you to safely move the machine away from the cab.
- 4. Move the machine away from the cab.
- 5. Lower the cab onto a carrier to allow you to move it to a storage location.

Note: Secure the wire harness and hoses to prevent damaging them when you lower or store the cab. Cover the cab to prevent dust and debris from accumulating on it while it is in storage.

- Install the brake pin through the brake pedals (Figure 21).
- Secure the pin using the bolt (1/4 x 3/4 inch) and locknut (Figure 21).
- 8. Use an assistant to help you align the roll bar to the machine (Figure 2).
- Use the 4 bolts (1/2 x 4-1/2 inches), washers, and locknuts to secure the roll bar to the machine (Figure 4).
- 10. Torque each bolt to 91 to 113 $N \cdot m$ (67 to 83 ft-lb).

This warranty is applicable to all products with the exception of Aerators (refer to separate warranty statements for these products). Where a warrantable condition exists, we will repair the Product at no cost to you including diagnostics, labor, parts, and transportation. This warranty begins on the date the Product is delivered to the original retail purchaser. * Product equipped with an hour meter.

Instructions for Obtaining Warranty Service
