Installation Instructions

Loose Parts

Preparing the Mower

No Parts Required

Procedure

- 1. Allow the machine to cool down before installing this kit.
- 2. Thoroughly clean the machine. All debris must be removed to ensure the kit will fit properly.
- 3. Repair all bent or damaged areas and replace any missing parts.



Removing the Existing Controls

No Parts Required

Procedure

- 1. Release the cushion for rear access.
- 2. From behind the engine, remove the hairpin cotter pin from the existing control linkage and front bracket (Figure 1).



1. Engine

- 3. Hairpin cotter pin
- 2. Existing control linkage
- 3. Remove the hairpin cotter pin and washer from the existing control linkage. Remove the existing control linkage from the forks and pump arm (Figure 2).
- 4. Remove the cable end from the fork (Figure 2).
- 5. Remove the cable end from the cable (Figure 2).
- 6. Remove the bolt, nut, spacer and washers from the fork and the upper and lower switch brackets (Figure 2).




- 7. Loosen the cable clamp securing the speed control cable jacket to the shifter bracket (Figure 3). It is easiest to access this under the lower frame and in front of the left rear wheel.

Replacing the Pump Arm

Parts needed for this procedure:

2 Obtain parts from an Authorized Service Dealer

Procedure


Note: This procedure is only for certain models of Grandstand mowers with the serial numbers listed.

Pump arms are not included in this kit. Contact an Authorized Service Dealer for the pump arms.

The following table lists the machines that need the pump arms replaced.

- 1. Remove the two nuts and bolts attached to the pump arm (Figure 4). Save this hardware.
- 2. Remove the pump arm from the fork (Figure 4).
- 3. Install the new pump arm with the existing hardware previously removed.

Installing the New Controls

Parts needed for this procedure:

2	Hairpin cotter pin
4	Flat washer
2	Speed control linkage
2	Shoulder hub
4	Flange nut (1/4 inch)
2	Bolt (1/4 x 1-3/8 inch)
2	Rod end ball joint
8	Roller bushing
2	Bolt (1/4 x 2-3/4 inch)
2	Control fork
1	Upper switch lever
1	Plastic cable tie


Procedure

- 1. Position the new fork with the pump arm in between the fork.
- 2. Install the new upper switch lever and existing lower switch lever onto the left hand shoulder hub (Figure 5).
- 3. Install the fork to the rear bracket with a new bolt (1/4 x 2-3/4 inch), washer, shoulder hub and a flange nut (1/4 inch) (Figure 5 and Figure 6). Do not tighten at this time.
- 4. Install the new speed control linkage to the fork with 3 roller bushings, a flat washer and a hairpin cotter pin (Figure 5).
- 5. From behind the engine, install the speed control linkage to the front bracket with a flat washer and a hairpin cotter pin (Figure 5 and Figure 6).
- 6. Thread the rod end ball joint all the way onto the end of the cable and then back it off 2 turns. DO NOT tighten the jam nut at this time.

Note: Ensure the ball joints are installed on the inside of the forks (Figure 6).

- 7. Install the rod end ball joint to the fork with a bolt (1/4 x 1-3/8 inch), roller bushing and flange nut (1/4 inch).
- 8. Hold the rod end ball joint perpendicular to the bolt when tightening the flange nut and bolt. This

- ensures the fork and cable will travel without binding (Figure 5).
- 9. Tighten the existing jam nut on the rod end ball joint. Make sure the cable does not have a twist in it.




- 1. Flat washer

- 5. Bolt (1/4 x 2-3/4 inch)


- 6. Flange nut (1/4 inch)

- 11. Existing large washer used on right side only (shown here for illustrative purposes)
- 12. New upper switch lever
- 13. Wrong position for the rod end ball joint (topview)
- 14. Correct position of rod end ball joint (topview)
- 15. Roller bushing

- Do not remove the existing switch
- 17. Use existing lower switch lever
- 18. Existing neutral stop arm on left side only
- Existing jam nut (tighten after installing rod end ball joint)

- 4. Existing large washer used on right side only
- Existing neutral stop arm on left side only
- 10. Using the plastic tie, fasten the speed control cable to the right control cable (Figure 7).

- 11. Perform this same procedure for the opposite control.


Adjusting the Speed Control

Parts needed for this procedure:


Plastic cable tie

Procedure

- 1. Set the HOC lever to 2 inches and move the speed control lever to the FAST position.
- 2. Ensure the cable clamp securing the speed control cable jacket to the shifter bracket is loose (Figure 10).
- 3. Loosen the bolt that goes through the center of the left hand shoulder hub and control fork (Figure 8).
- 4. Remove the hairpin cotter pin and washer from the end of the left hand speed control linkage assembly (Figure 8).



- 2. Loosen this bolt 1. Hairpin cotter pin and flat washer
- 5. In front of the left hand speed control linkage rollers, insert a 7/32nd inch allen wrench into the slots of the control fork and control arm (Figure 9).
- 6. Push the speed control linkage forward, and tighten the clamp securing the speed control cable jacket to the shifter bracket (Figure 9 and Figure 10).




- Cable clamp


7. The switch stop arm must be aligned with the cable end of the control fork. Using a cable tie, secure the neutral assembly to align the components

(Figure 11). Do not force the neutral assembly together.



- 1. Plastic cable tie
- 2. Upper switch lever
- Lower switch lever
- 4. Neutral stop arm
- 5. Switch (Do not remove)
- 8. While pulling the control fork assembly rearward (not so hard that the speed control linkage moves) tighten the screw that goes through the center of the left hand shoulder hub (Figure 12).

Note: It is important to keep the pump control arm and control fork slots are in line with each other. This can be achieved by making sure the top of the pump control arm and control fork are parallel to each other.



- 1. Movement of control arm
- 3. Tighten this bolt
- 2. Slots are aligned
- 9. Remove the allen wrench from slots of the control fork and control arm slots and cut the cable tie from the neutral assembly.
- 10. Install the washer and hair pin to the end of the speed control linkage.
- 11. Repeat steps 3 through 10 (do not do step 7) on the right hand side.
