## **Opening the Crate**

#### **No Parts Required**

#### **Procedure**

- 1. Lower the ends of the crate.
- 2. Remove the retaining straps.
- 3. Remove the plastic ties around the hopper handles.



# Removing the Machine from the Crate

## Parts needed for this procedure:

1	Rear caster wheel
1	Bolt (1/2 x 13 inches)
1	Locknut (1/2 inch)

#### **Driving the Machine Off the Crate**

## **A** CAUTION

The mower deck is shipped in the Up position, but not latched. Removing shipping reinforcements without supporting the front of the deck will cause the deck to drop which may result in injury or property damage.

Always securely support the front of the deck while setting up the unit.

**Note:** Ensure the discharge tube does not catch on the crate when driving the machine off the crate (Figure 4).

1. Remove the rear caster wheel assembly from inside the hopper.


2. Remove the bolt holding the rear-frame support to the frame (Figure 1).

#### **A** CAUTION


Raising the mower deck for service or maintenance relying solely on mechanical or hydraulic jacks could be dangerous. The mechanical or hydraulic jacks may not be enough support or may malfunction allowing the unit to fall, which could cause injury.

Do Not rely solely on mechanical or hydraulic jacks for support. Use adequate jack stands or equivalent support.

3. Raise the rear of the unit approximately 25.4 to 30.5 cm (10 to 12 inches) and support it with jack stands or equivalent support (Figure 1).



- 1. Rear caster fork
- 3. Place the jack stands at the arrows
- 2. Bolt holding the rear-frame support
- 4. Remove and discard the rear-frame support, located behind the drive tires, from the machine.
- 5. Install the rear caster wheel to the rear caster fork with a bolt (1/2 x 13 inches) and locknut (1/2 inch) (Figure 2).
- 6. Torque the bolt to 90.8 to 112.5 N-m (67 to 83 ft-lb).




- 1. Bolt (1/2 x 13 inches)

- Rear caster wheel
- 7. Carefully remove the jack stands and lower the machine.

**Important:** Ensure the mower deck is in the upright position before raising the front of the machine.

8. Raise the front of the machine and support it with jack stands or an equivalent support (Figure 3).

**Note:** Lift the deck just enough to remove the deck support and to insert other supports into the crate opening.




- 1. Place jack stands at the arrows
- 9. Remove and discard the deck support from under the rear deck rollers.


**Note:** Before the deck is lowered into the operating position (steps 10 through 14), the crate opening under the deck must be fully covered.

10. Place a plywood sheet (58.4 cm x 81.3 cm (23 inches x 32 inches)), or similar support, over the opening to


provide support for the deck when the unit is driven off of the crate (Figure 4).




- 1. Drive tire
- 3. Plywood sheet under the rear deck rollers
- 2. Discharge tube
- 11. Carefully remove the jack stands and lower the machine.
- 12. While supporting the mower deck, remove and discard the two side struts, mounting brackets, and their hardware on both sides of the seat (Figure 5).
- 13. Remove and discard the strut located between the front deck support pins (Figure 5).




- 1. Deck support pin
- Strut between deck support pins
- 3. Side strut hardware
- 14. With the deck locking pins pulled out in the unlock position, carefully lower the deck (Figure 6).



- 1. Deck lift handle
- Push the deck locking pin in and rotate toward the front to lock
- 2. Rotate the deck locking pin toward the rear and pull outward to unlock
- 15. Push the deck-locking pins inward and rotate them forward to securely lock the deck in the lowered position.
- 16. Raise the mower deck to the highest height-of-cut position.
- 17. Install pieces of wood, to form a ramp, in front of the rear tire (Figure 7).



- Rear tire
- Wood ramp
- 18. To form a ramp, place 2 long pieces of wood (2 x 4's) in front of each front-caster tire (Figure 8).



- Front caster
- 2. Rear deck rollers
- 3. Plywood between drive wheels
- 4. Wood ramp for front casters (2 x 4's)

**Note:** Ensure the discharge tube does not catch on the crate when driving the machine off the crate (Figure 4).

## Removing the Machine from the Crate Using a Hoist


Always securely support the front of the deck while setting up the unit.

1. Remove the rear caster wheel assembly from inside the hopper.

- Remove the bolt holding the rear frame to the crate (Figure 11).
- 3. Lift the front of the hopper up.

**Note:** Use care when hoisting the machine to prevent damage to the hopper.

4. Using the hoist, lift the machine at the location shown in Figure 9.




1. With the hopper up, lift the machine on each side here





- 8. Torque the bolt to 90.8 to 112.5 N-m (67 to 83 ft-lb).

- 12. Place the hoist hooks on each side of the seat as shown in Figure 12.

**Important:** Ensure the mower deck is in the upright position before raising the front of the machine.

- 13. Raise up the front of the machine, just enough to remove and discard the deck support from under the rear deck rollers.
- 14. Lower the machine to the ground.
- 15. Lift the front of the hopper up.
- 16. Using the hoist, lift the machine at the locations shown in Figure 9 and Figure 12.
- 17. Remove the crate from under the machine.
- 18. Lower the machine to the ground.
- 19. While supporting the mower deck, remove and discard the two side struts, mounting brackets, and their hardware on both sides of the seat (Figure 13).
- 20. Remove and discard the strut located between the front deck support pins (Figure 13).



21. With the deck locking pins pulled out in the unlock position, carefully lower the deck (Figure 14).



## **Checking the Tire Pressure**

## Installing the Battery

#### Parts needed for this procedure:

2 Wing nut (1/4 inch)

#### **Procedure**

#### **A WARNING**

Locate the battery-mounting hardware and install the negative battery cable. Refer to Installing the Battery in the *Operator's Manual*.

**Note:** If the positive cable is also disconnected, connect the positive (red) cable to the positive battery terminal first, then the negative (black) cable to the negative battery terminal. Slip insulator boot over the positive terminal.

**Note:** If time does not permit charging the battery, or if charging equipment is not available, connect the negative battery cable and run the vehicle continuously for 20 to 30 minutes to sufficiently charge the battery.



## **Charging the Battery**

## No Parts Required

#### **Procedure**


## **A WARNING**

Charging the battery produces gasses that can explode and cause serious injury.

- Keep cigarettes, sparks and flames away from the battery.
- Make sure the ignition switch is off.
- Ventilate when charging or using the battery in an enclosed space.

**Important:** Do not run the machine with the battery disconnected; electrical damage may occur to the engine.

Charge the battery. Refer to the Operator's Manual for instructions.


## **Checking the Hydraulic Oil**

#### No Parts Required

#### **Procedure**

The machine is shipped with hydraulic oil in the reservoir.

- 1. Check and ensure the reservoir has hydraulic oil.
- 2. If needed add Toro HYPR-OIL<sup>TM</sup> 500 hydraulic oil.
- 3. Run the machine for approximately 15 minutes to allow any extra air to purge out of the hydraulic system.
- 4. Wait until the unit cools before checking the hydraulic oil.
- 5. Tilt the hopper up.
- 6. Remove the hydraulic reservoir cap.
- 7. Wipe the dipstick clean and insert the cap back into the hydro.
- 8. Lightly tighten the cap.
- 9. Remove the cap again and check the level of the oil on the dipstick (Figure 16).
- Check the hydraulic reservoir and if necessary fill the reservoir to the appropriate level with Toro HYPR-OIL<sup>TM</sup> 500 hydraulic oil.



1. Full

- 2. Add
- 11. If the dipstick oil level is at the Add mark, add hydraulic oil. Do not overfill.
- 12. Replace hydraulic reservoir cap and tighten until snug. Do not overtighten.
